
The money made from the fees would be ploughed back into the force to "further develop and enhance services provided to its customers", it added.

### A good sign for schools in Dubai

More than half of the private schools in Dubal are now ranked 'good' or above, according to the latest round of inspections by the education regulator. Releasing the 2015-2016 Dubai private schools inspection report, Dr Abdulla Al Karam, Chairman of the Board of Directors and Director General of the Knowledge and Human Development Authority (KHDA), said that there has been an eight per cent growth in schools improving from 'good' to 'very good' and 'outstanding' - the biggest increase in school improvement ratings since 2011. Out of the 149 schools inspected, 16 schools were rated as outstanding. 13 were read. 57 Out of the 149 schools inspected, 16 schools were rated as outstanding, 13 very good, 57 good, 56 acceptable and seven were rated weak.

The inspection results follow a February announcement by the KHDA that schools rated as 'good' and above can charge 6.42 per cent more for tuition fees for the 2016-2017 academic year.



Thought-provoking images on show


he Paris agreement, adopted by 195

submitting images last year, and you


